### School Rules

- It is mandatory for all parents and students to go through the e-almanac.
- The student should affix his/her photograph and fill in the required information, duly signed by the parents, in the space provided for in the Almanac.
- Students must wear their school I-Cards during school hours.
- Students who come to school by their own conveyance should reach school five minutes before the bell rings.
- The ringing of the bell in the morning is a signal for students to assemble immediately in perfect silence. As soon as they get back to their classes, they should get their books ready for the first period.
- The school uniform, only in prescribed school colour, should be immaculate, clean and smart, and should be worn on all working days, school functions and PTM's. In winters, school jacket is compulsory. Action will be taken against students who are habitually improperly dressed.
- Boys should have neatly trimmed hair and girls should either cut their hair short/neatly tie in plaits. The hemline of the skirt worn by the girl student should touch the knee.
- Name, class, section and admission number must be clearly marked on all the belongings of students.
- Special care must be taken of all school property. Do not litter and use the garbage bins. Do not scratch or spoil the desks, chairs and charts or damage school furniture. Do not write or draw anything on the walls or damage things / belongings of others.
- 10. Damage or breakage done even accidently should be reported to the class teacher. The students will be required to pay for any damage to school property. The school reserves the right to suspend/expel students whose conduct is harmful to other students or to the school.

- Consuming vape is strictly prohibited. Any student caught with the same would be liable to get expelled from the school.
- Students are not allowed to use the school telephone without the permission of the Principal. They will not be called to answer phone calls during school hours.
- Students are not permitted to take either half day or short leave without prior permission of the Principal.
- Students must move in an orderly manner while they are moving from one place to another in the school premises.
- Students are not allowed to bring personal sports equipments to school and the school will not take the responsibility of any loss/damage.
- 16. Students are not allowed to carry mobile phones inside the school premises. Refer to CBSE Circular No. CBSE/AFF./CIRCULARS/2009/02 dated 29 July 2009. If a student brings mobile phone to school, it will be confiscated for the rest of the session.
- School will not support any private party inside or outside the school premises.
- Birthday celebrations are not encouraged in the school. Parents are requested not to send cakes/ return gifts to school. Only chocolates/sweets worth not more than Rs. 20/- can be sent for distribution.
- Students are allowed to use school canteen during break time only and they are not permitted to buy eatables from vendors outside the school premises.
- 20. Discourtesy and disrespect to teachers, disobedience and irregular attendance, misbehaviour inside the school premises or in the school conveyance will lead to disciplinary action against the concerned students. Orange Card will be issued on violation of the rule.

### School Rules



- A fine of Rs. 2000 will be levied on any student found tampering/destroying the CCTV cameras installed in the school premises.
- No student is allowed to come to school in self driven vehicle. Refer to CBSE circular no. DE.23(555)/Sch. Br./2014/1900 Dated - 3/11/16
- 23. KRM students should observe polite standards wherever they go. They should always remember that the school is judged by their conduct. They should greet their teachers when they meet them . Bullying and use of foul language is prohibited and punishable as per school rules.
- Any student found using unfair means during tests will be given zero in the subject. Repetition of the same will result in suspension/expulsion from the school.
- 25. Parents who make independent transport arrangements for their ward by hiring vans/rickshaws etc. will be fully responsible for the same. They must ensure that proper verification of drivers, rickshaw pullers is done and all safety measures have been taken to avoid any untoward incident.

### **Transport Rules**

 An optional transport facility is made available to the students. Students can avail the school transport subject to availability of seats from any particular area. In case, the school transport is not available, the parents will have to make their own arrangements. Chartered bus routes by the school will not change and any request for the same will not be entertained. Transport fee is levied keeping the budget and all overhead expenses in view and is at the sole discretion of the management.

- Mid session withdrawl from use of transport will be permitted only against one month written notice to the transport in-charge or payment of one month fee in lieu thereof.

- It is mandatory for all parents who wish their ward to discontinue the usage of school transport to deposit a Bus Security Refund Form. Bus Security will be refunded at the end of the academic session in which the bus services are withdrawn.
- No student will be allowed to travel by school bus without his/her Identity card. He/she must be in proper school uniform.
- The bus drivers are authorized to stop the bus only at the designated stops. The bus will not wait for late comers. Parents/Guardians must carry school I-Cards.

# **Guidelines for Parents**

- The school has a provision for Enrichment/Remedial classes for students on working saturdays in order to encourage them to strengthen their scholastic areas. Buses will ply for the students.
- Parents are requested to read the contents of the School Almanac carefully and in the interest of the child, abide by the rules and regulations laid down by the school. Kindly check your ward's almanac daily.
- Whenever you correspond with the school about your son/ daughter, kindly quote his/her full name, class and section.
   All communications should be addressed to the Principal.
   Parents are requested to inform the school immediately if there is any change in address or telephone number.
- Parents should carry out their responsibilities as joint educators in instilling in their children respect and strict obedience for all school rules and regulations.
- The students should reach school latest by 7:30 am. They
  may be given entry latest by 7:35 am, keeping in mind the
  heavy morning traffic outside. However, the child will be
  sent back home after two repeated late comings beyond
  7:35 am.
- Students should always wear their school I- Card and proper school uniform. Regular defaulters will be sent back home.
- Parents are requested to send all the required material asked by the school in the morning with their ward. Phone calls during the school hours will not be entertained.
- Kindly ensure that your ward carries school books, exercise books according to the time table for that day.

- Apart from the training given by the school, students are expected to devote some time regularly at home. Supervision of the same should be arranged. Any problem relating to home work should be recorded in the note books/ school almanac by the parents.
- Parents are requested to fix important appointments such as, with the doctor of their ward after school hours or on holidays.
- Students are not permitted to take either half day or short leave without prior permission of the Principal.
- The school has a system of fruit break. You are requested to ensure that the child carries at least one fruit every day.
- 13. Every student is expected to maintain an attendance record of at least 90% during the academic year, failing which he/ she may not be allowed to appear in the Final Examination in March.

- 18. The facility of internet is required by the students to do their homework and project work. As a parent, you are required to monitor the usage of internet by your ward so that he/she does not misuse the internet access. It is advisable to route your child's E-mail through your account and share their password. Also, keep the computer in a central family location, not in the child's room. The usage of computer should be a family activity.
- 19. Parents are requested to sign the reports, test papers, teacher's remarks in the note books and school almanac and other similar documents so that they may keep in close touch with the progress of their child. Parents are also expected to visit the teachers whenever called, requested or on PTM's.
- Regular meetings give an opportunity to the parents and teachers to discuss the progress of the child. It is also compulsory for the parents to meet the class teacher on the result declaration day.
- 21. Please do not send your child to school if he/she is feeling unwell. A proper leave application must be submitted in writing by the parents to the Principal in case of absence. This should be supported by a medical certificate in case of sick leave for more than three consecutive days.
- Criticism of a teacher of the school in the presence of a child must be scrupulously avoided as it causes students to lose respect for their teacher with the consequent failure to learn from her, thus retarding the child's progress.
- 23. If you would like to celebrate the birthday of your ward, you are requested to send only toffees/eclairs to be distributed as a gesture in the class. It would be a good gesture to contribute one book to the school library on your child's birthday. Parents are requested to send the child in the school uniform.
- 24. As the medium of instruction in this school is English, students should be helped with regular English conversation practice at home so that they could keep pace with the class.
- 25. Plan future education of your ward(s) beyond the school in good time, so that they may be eligible to compete for admission to the maximum number of institutions for higher education.
- 26. Any parent spreading disaffection would be liable to get his/her child expelled from the school.
- 27. Carrying mobile phones and vapes is strictly prohibited, and any violation will result in confiscation upon discovery.
- Carpooling or utilizing the school bus facility is encouraged as sustainable transportation options promoting community and environmental responsibility. Vehicles carrying only one child will not be permitted entry into the school's vicinity.
- 29. As an advisory, students are encouraged to wear black full sleeves shirts and full pants to protect from dengue/seasonal illness.

# Mode of Fee Payment and International Admissions

- It is noticed that parents prefer to pay fee on quarterly basis (ie Apr-Jun; Jul-Sep; Oct-Dec And Jan-March). The last date for payment of fee in such cases will be 10th day of the Quarter when the quarter starts. The parents who, with prior consent of the school, opt for payment of fee on monthly basis, will be required to pay the fee by 5th day of the month to which it relates. The delay in payment of fee will attract a penalty of Rs 50 per day and the delay of more than 15 days may lead to striking of the name of the student.
- Fee can be paid by cheque/demand draft in favour of "K. R. MANGALAM WORLD SCHOOL". Post-dated/ corrected/over written or mutilated cheques will not be accepted.

### LATE FEE FINE

Any delay in payment of fees will invite late fee fine. It may also lead to the student's name being struck off the rolls as per Rule 35 of the Delhi School Education Rules 1973.

### RE-ADMISSION

Re-admission will be allowed only after payment of outstanding dues by Demand Draft only including late fee fine and the prescribed re-admission fee/charge.

### DISHONOURED CHEQUES

In case of a cheque issued towards any payment due to the

school is dishonoured on its presentation to the bank for insufficient funds or any other reason, a penalty of Rs. 500 will be charged.

### RULES REGARDING WITHDRAWALS

If a student wishes to withdraw from the school, the transfer certificate will be issued on one month's written notice by the parent or payment of one month's fee in lieu thereof. Admission fee will not be refunded in any case.

If a student is absent without any reason for more than 6 days, his/her name may be struck off the school rolls as per Delhi School Education Rules.

Formative Assessment: represents the process of gathering, analyzing, interpreting and using the evidence to improve student learning and to help students achieve their utmost potential. It is one essential component of classroom practice and needs to be integrated into the curriculum. We, at K.R. Mangalam World School, G.K-II adopt a variety of strategies and tools for Formative Assessment:

Some of these are: Monday Tests, Home Assignments, classwork, written work, research, projects, worksheets, problem solving, Oral Activities, Practical work, Group work in the form of research projects, Group discussions, Peer assessment, Field work etc.

There is continuous evaluation followed by regular feedback to learners in the form of tutorials and discussions. The Formative Assessment Strategies that are being undertaken provide a balanced view of the student. The formative assessment will help teachers to:

Identify and respond to students' differential needs and styles of learning.

Support each student to achieve his/her individual potential.

Teach students to reflect on their own learning and to analyse their personal strengths and weaknesses in a constructive manner.

Rubrics for assessment of all subjects are framed by the respective teachers as per the assessment objectives laid by CBSE & NCERT. Each component of the rubric is assessed by awarding marks on different skills developed during the teaching-learning process.

The components are as follows: Observations: All students will be observed regularly with a focus on the individual, the group and the whole class, on punctuality, interest, attentiveness, student's self-reflection, self and peer assessment etc.

Research: Students will be presented with tasks that represent challenges, risk etc. These include performance in Monday tests, recalling session, homework, reports, essay etc. Inter-disciplinary Skills: (research, thinking, communication, self-management): The focus is on the process and skill application rather than on the product.

Learner Profile Attributes: The development of learner profile attributes during the teaching learning process will be assessed. Open-Ended questions: Students will be presented with a challenge and asked to provide an original response in class room discussions. Tests/Quizzes: These are aimed at providing a snapshot of students' specific knowledge that he/she acquires.

Portfolios and Goal Setting: Students will be expected to maintain a file consisting of records of special work produced by them during each session and reflections on what they have achieved. These would be an evidence of what they have done in class.

#### Assessment Plan

For Classes III to V:\* The assessment policy for Classes III to V includes Summative Assessments (SA1 & SA2) at the end of each term, with SA1 in September and SA2 in February.

- \* Monday assessments will be conducted once per term \* Assessments will include pen & paper tests, learning engagements, and subject enrichment activities.
- \* Grade V students scoring below 33% in the year-end exam must clear a retest to be promoted. \* A 'No Retest' policy applies, except for extreme medical cases with Principal's approval.

For Foundational Stage: The school will follow a system of Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation. A Holistic Progress report will be prepared comprising of three sections - Unit Based Assessment, Subject specific assessment and General Reflections. Four assessments will be conducted throughout the year based on Trans disciplinary Theme, Language, Visual and Performing Arts, Numeracy, Physical Education, and individual reflections. The skills tested will be Social Skills, Life Skills, Literacy Skills, Self-Management and Discipline focus. The Competencies mapped will be Critical Thinking/ Problem Solving, Oral Communications, Team work and Collaboration, Character Building and Citizenship. The Holistic Report Card will be shared with the parents after every assessment.

### Medical Guidance



### All parents are requested to impart health education to their children.

- Maintain personal hygiene and cleanliness. (trimming of nails, regular hair cut etc.)
- b. Ensure that they sleep eight hours a day.
- c. Ensure they exercise daily.
- d. Have a balanced diet, nutritionally rich in proteins and milk
- e. Drink water which is either boiled or filtered. All students are advised to bring their own water bottles from home.
- f. Avoid consumption of ice-creams, other milk products and eatables from road-side vendors.
- De-worm all children at least once every year-advice to be taken from their family physician.

### Get a dental and an ophthalmic check up done once every year.

A student returning to school after suffering from an infectious or contagious disease should produce a doctor's certificate of fitness permitting him/her to attend the school.

Students suffering from the following diseases must observe the prescribed period of quarantine before returning to class.

Students are not allowed to enter the medical room without his / her almanac.

Students suffering from infectious diseases like Conjunctivitis, Dermatitis, Scabies, etc. should not be sent to school.

Students suffering from chronic diseases like Asthma, Epilepsy, Rheumatic Heart Disease, etc. are advised to be under continuous medical supervision of a Specialist Doctor. History of their illness must be filled up in the KRM Almanac along with the details of treatment being taken.
