



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



CLASS IV PRESENTATION CHRISTMAS



CONCEPT OF 'MORE'

The activity helped them develop counting, observation, and comparison skills while making learning enjoyable and engaging.

SCIENCE EXPERIMENT

To enhance experiential learning and scientific understanding, students from various classes enthusiastically participated in various Science Practicals conducted the class. The Science Practicals provided a valuable learning experience, strengthening the connection between classroom learning and real-life application.

Learners from Cam-4 tested various food items for the presence of starch, using Iodine solution under the Unit- The Digestive System. They were thrilled to see the colour change and record their observations as per the topic.



Learners from Cam-5 observed different types of rock samples under the unit- The rock and rock cycle. They were amazed to see the samples of Igneous, Sedimentary and metamorphic rocks.



OUTDOOR LEARNING EXPERIENCE

As part of an outdoor learning experience, the students of Grade 1 went on a guided stroll around the school premises to observe and appreciate the beauty of nature. During the walk, they keenly observed various plants, flowers, and natural elements in their surroundings. The students were fascinated to spot insects such as grasshoppers and centipedes, and even observed an ant hill closely. Following the stroll, the children drew what they had observed on a sheet of paper, which was later pasted in their notebooks. This hands-on experience helped them connect with nature and develop curiosity about the environment and the living creatures around them.

Through this support, the students have been able to stay connected with the classroom proceedings and actively participate in the learning process.


Safiya Liana Kamal of Grade 1 and Nevaan Nagpal of Grade 8 have been consistently availing this facility and benefitting from the sessions.

Young Scientists in Action: Experiments on Sound and PH

Learners of Grade 6 explored the concept of sound through hands-on investigation, examining whether sound requires vibrations to travel. Using simple materials such as disposable cups and thread, they experimented with different string positions to observe how changes affected the sound produced, thereby strengthening their understanding of sound transmission.



Additionally, learners of Grades 6, 7, and 8 conducted practical experiments to test the pH of various substances using a universal indicator. Through observation and analysis, they classified substances as acidic, basic, or neutral, developing scientific inquiry skills and reinforcing conceptual understanding through experiential learning.



Cambridge Phonic & Handwriting Workshop

An excellent opportunity was given by Cambridge University Press & Assessment on their book launch and workshop on 'Cambridge Phonic and Handwriting' by Mr. Edward Rippeth at The Park, Sansad Marg, Connaught Place, New Delhi on Nov 29, 2025, Saturday. The book has been designed to help young learners build strong foundations in reading and writing.

Mr. Rippeth said that Bloom's Taxonomy is important for Early Years in the Cambridge curriculum, as it provides a framework for developing critical thinking and creating a clear learning path.
