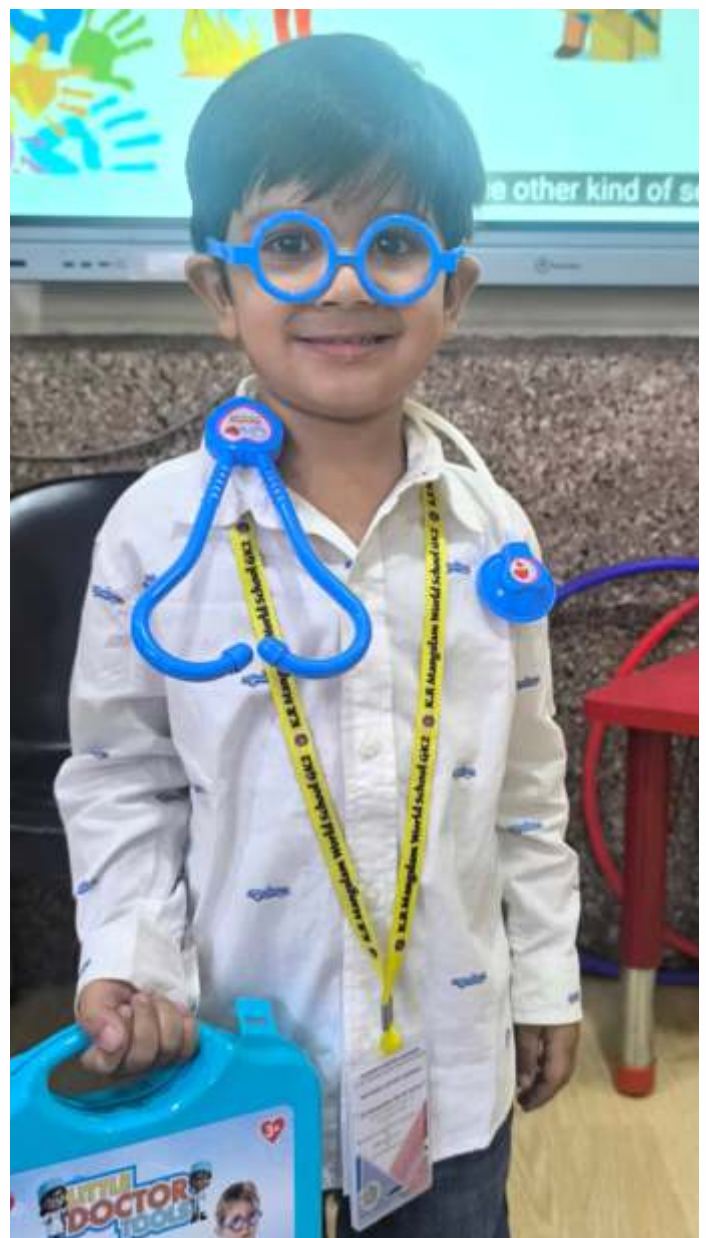
LEMONADE ACTIVITY

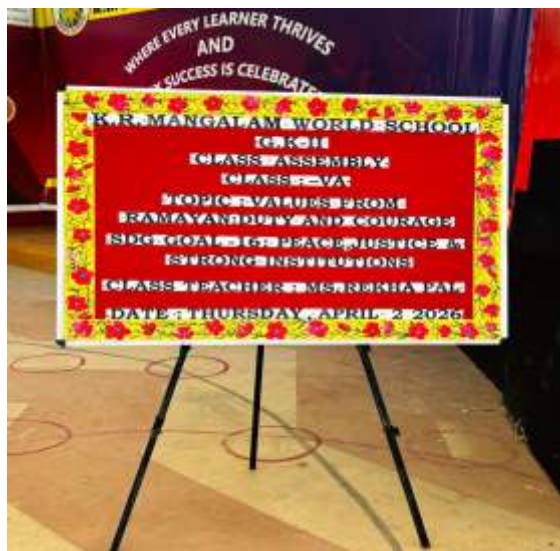
SEED GERMINATION

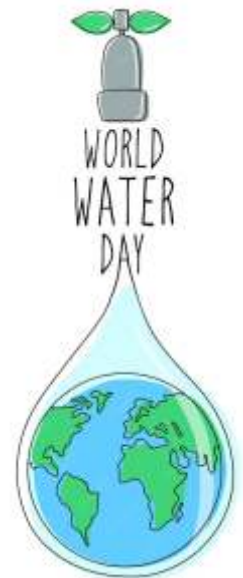
EDUCATIONAL EXCURSION TO AMRITSAR

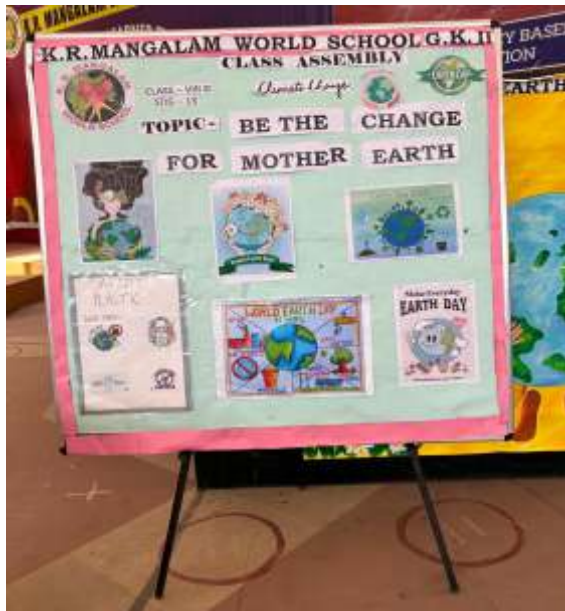
Overall, the assembly was engaging, informative and impactful. It successfully spread awareness about the importance of health and encouraged everyone to adopt healthier habits in their daily lives.

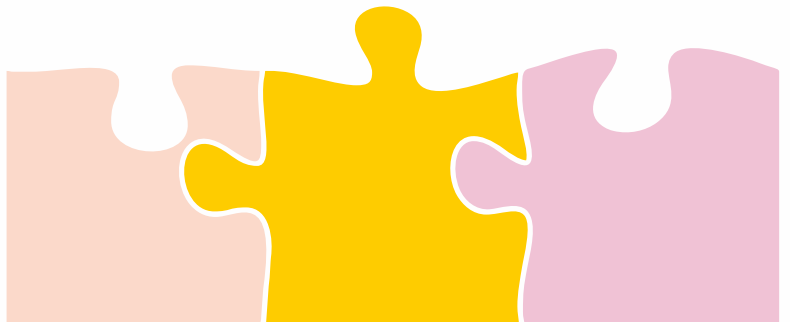

CARPENTRY AND SCIENCE WORKSHOP

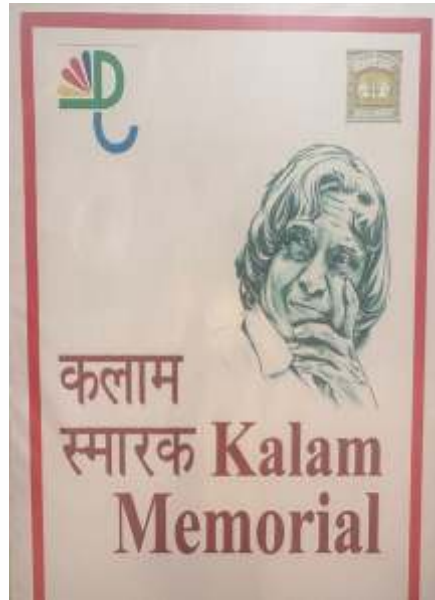
Learning by doing is the best way of understanding.

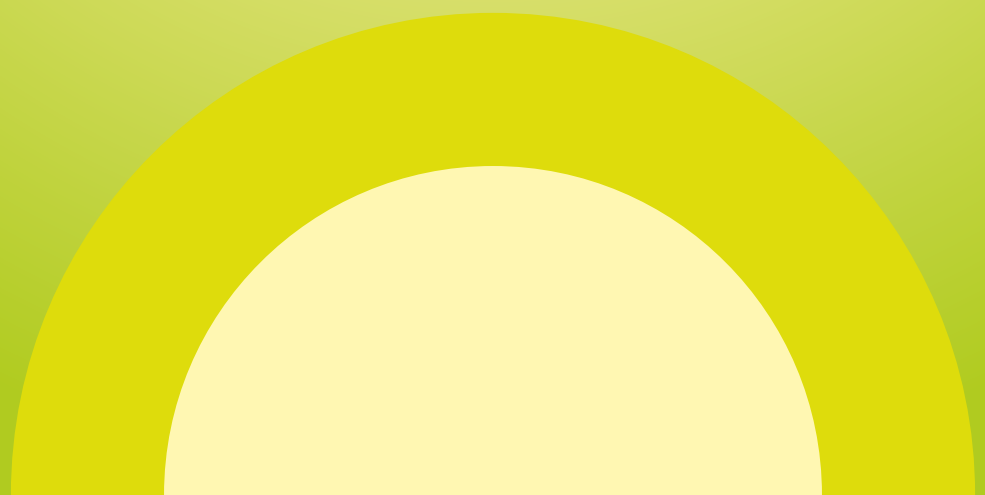
RANGLOK INTER SCHOOL ART FEST-2026

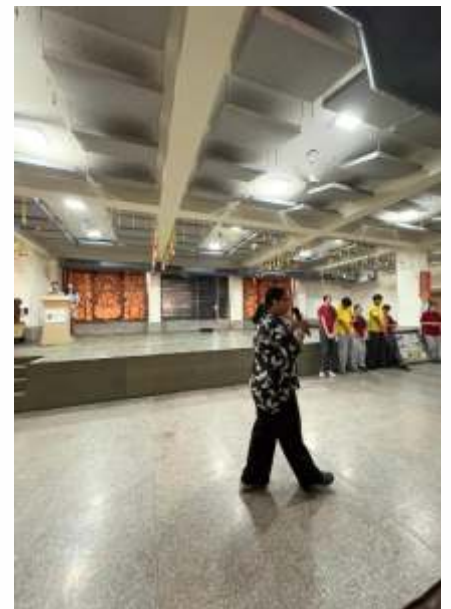
SEMINAR ON NEW CURRICULUM

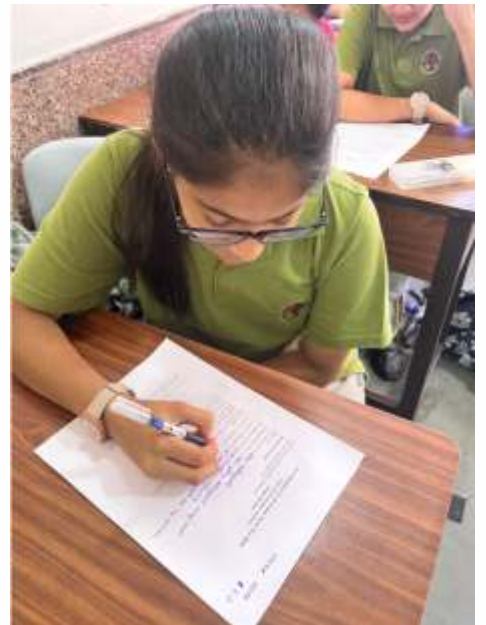
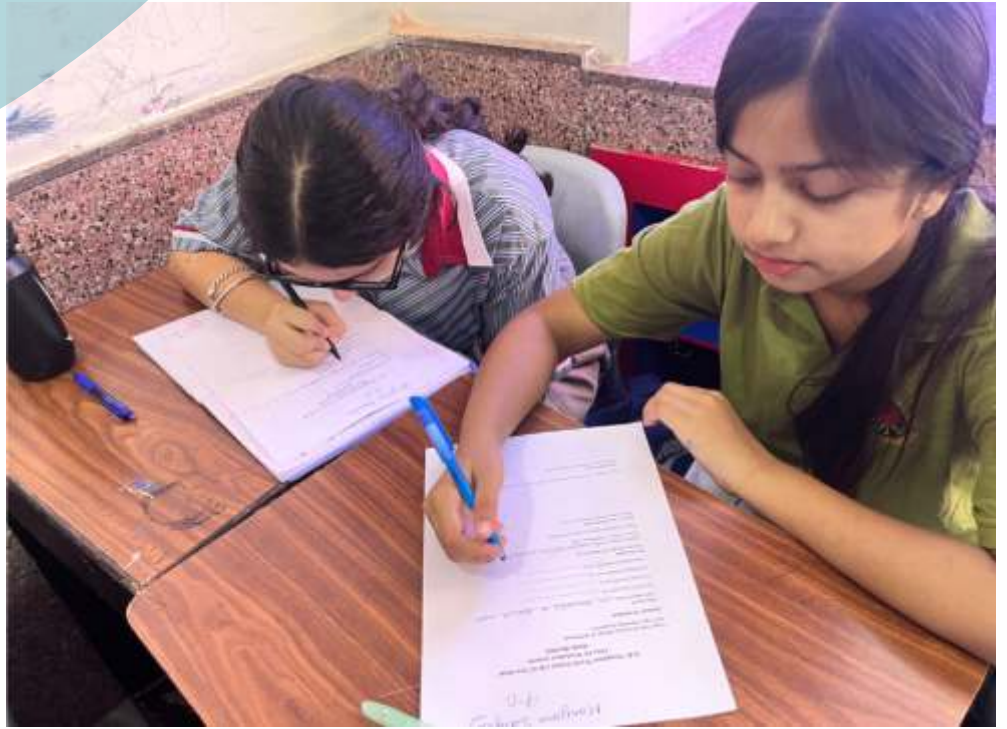
CLASS ASSEMBLY: XII-F VALUES, AWARENESS, CREATIVITY
