


# Prakash Utsav

<u>Activity</u>: Enhancing Early Language Development Through Play-Based Learning with Foam Letters

Early childhood is a crucial period for language acquisition and development. Recognizing the significance of play-based learning, this study aims to assess the effectiveness of using foam letters as a tool for fostering language skills in early years students. The emphasis is on unstructured play and hands-on activities to create an engaging and enjoyable learning environment.

This study explores the impact of integrating foam letters into free play activities for early years students, emphasizing the recapitulation of letters and their association with objects sharing corresponding initial sounds. Through unstructured play sessions, students engaged with foam

letters, promoting sensory exploration and tactile learning. Structured activities, including games and storytelling, reinforced letter recognition, while encouraging students to connect letters with objects enhanced vocabulary and language comprehension. Results showed improved letter recognition, expanded vocabulary, and enhanced social skills, suggesting that the combination of free play with foam letters, recapitulation, and object association contributes positively to early language development, providing educators and caregivers with a valuable approach to foster a holistic learning experience for young learners.



<u>Activity</u>: Promoting Physical Development in Early Years Students Through Purposeful Exercise

In an effort to prioritize the holistic development of early years students, this study investigates the positive impact of incorporating purposeful exercise into their daily routines. # **ENGLISH**



The learners of grade 3 enthusiastically participated in an activity wherein they were asked to draft a questionnaire based on the probability of chance, followed by an interview with their partners.






Introducing Fractions - Learners of Grade 2 were engaged in exploring different parts of a whole using fraction kit.

Our young learners were curious to know the magical world of magnets. They were totally involved in knowing the various properties of bar magnets. They were also discussing the various uses of magnets.






