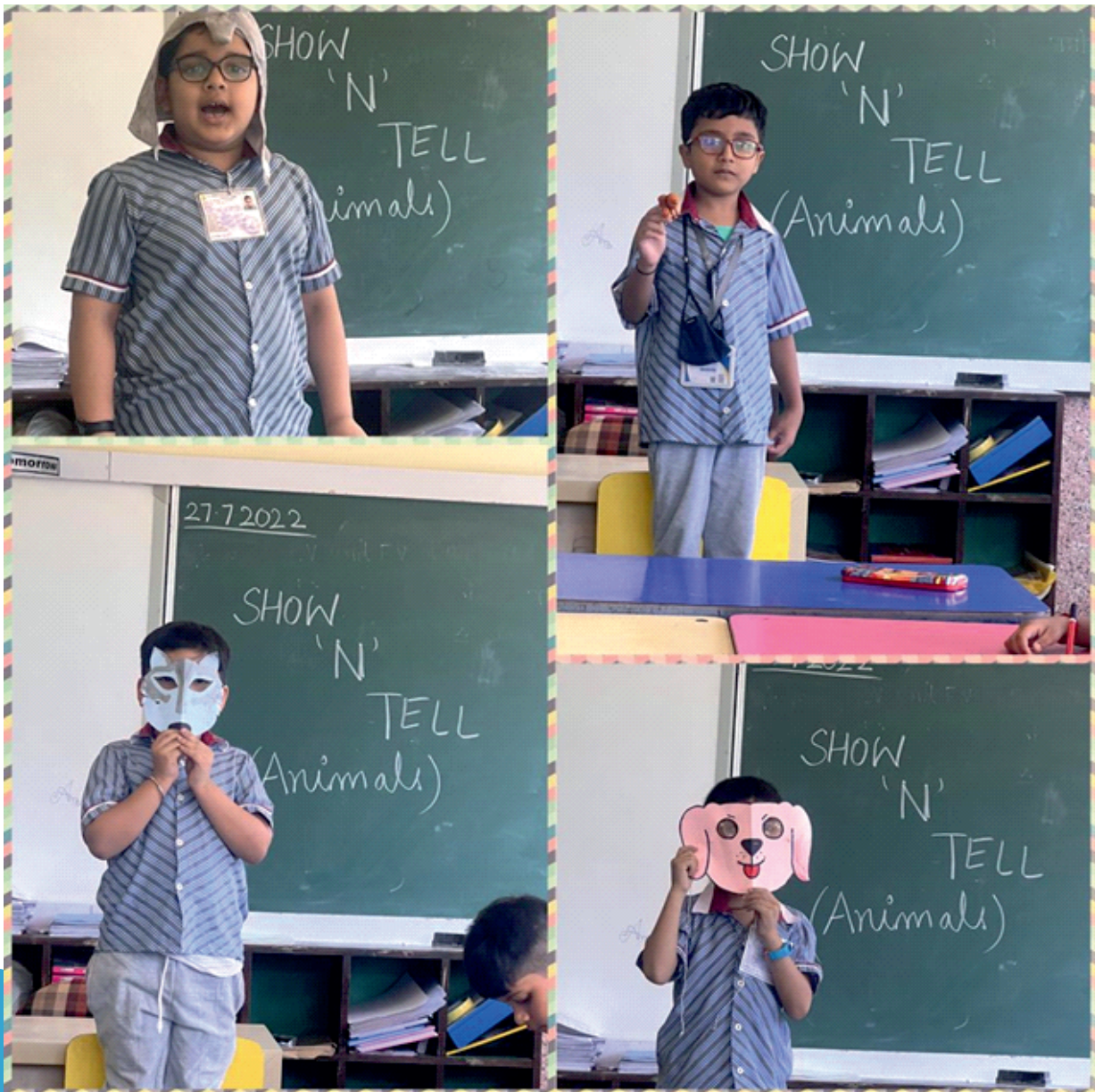

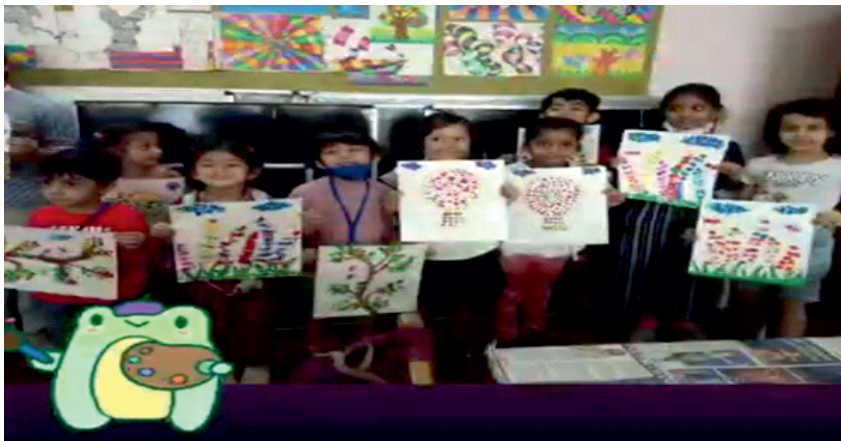

WORKSHOP ON CYBER CRIME AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

K.R Mangalam World School promotes mental health of the students and substance use prevention in the school. Substance abuse causes disruptions in the brain development, manipulates the brain's wiring and affects the way the brain processes and retains information. Not only can it impair students' cognitive development, it can also affect their performance in school, their ability to memorize things, concentration in the classroom, prioritization of assignments, likelihood to attend class, and even their overall IQ. Substance abuse is associated with other harmful behaviours, and is incompatible with the school climate of respect, safety, and support for learning.

Our school also endeavours to create awareness about the usage of networking devices, which have become a part and parcel of everyone's life. A student who is unaware of the uses of cyber world is vulnerable to the risks it poses.

In order to create awareness amongst the pupils of the 21st century, about the hazards of the virtual world and substance abuse, a workshop was organized at K.R Mangalam World School. Sh. H.S Randhawa, Assistant Commissioner of Police of Cyber Crime Unit, Delhi Police and S I Satwant Singh of Anti- Narcotics Task Force, Delhi Police conducted the workshop. Their erudite knowledge was well received by the attentive audience, as various aspects of the subject unfolded. The salient features of the workshop were impact of internet on students, prevention of substance use among students and information and safety tips regarding online threats. The entire workshop was conducted in an interactive manner, as a lot of pertinent questions were raised, which were answered in great detail. The entire

session was meticulously designed and executed; it covered a wide range of issues from morphing to online predators.

Mr. Randhawa discussed the reasons behind an increased rate of cyber-crime and also shared measures that could be easily taken by the users to effectively avoid being victims of it. He explained how one must be mindful while using networking devices, as they create digital footprints. Cyber bullying was another matter which was discussed at great length, so as to avoid youngsters falling in its pangs. The students were also made aware of dark net and surface net during the course of the workshop. The data and the real time case studies discussed, helped the students to understand the message with absolute clarity.

Mr. Singh created awareness among the students about all the physical, psychological and long-term effects of Substance Abuse. The sole purpose of conducting the workshop was to sensitize the students about the issues related to drugs. He talked about the peer pressure and the 'gateway' drug that eventually turns a person into an addict.

The workshop was extremely informative and enlightening. The session was successfully concluded by a question-answer session involving the resource person and the students attending the workshop.
