CLASS: III D


**DATE: OCTOBER 13, 2022 TOPIC:

Leadership programs create experiences where students build both mindset and skills to foster a culture that enhances social Consciousness and school spirit.


A structured leadership camp of four nights and five days was organised at Junga, Chail, and Himachal Pradesh in collaboration with INME, Youreka.

She realized that the pent-up bottled-up emotions and the social taboo stopping open talks about mental health led to adverse effects on mental well-being. - Raising awareness on various types of abuse, doctors and psychiatrists webinar to identify, cope and combat various types of abuses.
- Anti-bully week and workshops by a trained psychologist
- Good touch bad touch workshop for Delhi Army Primary School -1
- Teachers workshops on inclusivity and mental health, Stress Management workshop with teachers of Delhi Army Primary School -2 by trained psychologists
- Series of workshops on empowerment by Dr. Pradeep Chadha, Ireland
- Mental health walks conducted in Delhi- NCR to raise awareness on the benefits of walking on mental health.

➤ **BOILING ALIVE**

So was burnt the chair of the dictator.


People now fed up with rulers,
